At this meeting, in accordance with Section 21-1-10 of the Commission's Administrative Rules, the Commission should elect a Chair and Vice Chair for 2019. Section 21-1-10 of the Commission's Rules provides as follows:

§21-1-10 <u>Chairperson and vice-chairperson</u>. (a) A chairperson shall be elected by secret ballot vote by a majority of all the members to which the commission is entitled, who shall serve for a term of one year or until a successor is elected, with such term to commence on January 1 of each year.

(b) A vice-chairperson, who shall call and chair meetings in the incapacity or absence of the chairperson, shall be elected by secret ballot vote by a majority of all the members to which the commission is entitled, and shall serve for a term of one year or until a successor is elected, with such term to commence on January 1 of each year.
