IV. 2021 Legislative Session

- 1. Post-employment
 - i. <u>H.B. 671</u> Prohibits certain state officials and employees from representing certain interests before the State for twelve months after termination from their respective positions. Specifies that the prohibition against disclosing certain information applies to those who were employed by the State for less than one hundred eighty-one days. Effective 1/1/2022. (SD2).

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- 2. Lobbyists Law
 - i. <u>H.B. 741</u> Requires certain Hawaii state ethics commission records to be retained for a period of six years from the date of filing. (SD1).
- 3. Budget
 - i. <u>H.B. 1</u> Appropriates funds to provide for the expenses of the Legislature, Auditor, Legislative Reference Bureau, Ombudsman, and Ethics Commission.
- 4. Training
 - i. <u>S.B. 82</u> Requires each new member of a board or commission to participate in an orientation and training session with the head of the department with jurisdiction of that member's board or commission or their designee. Requires each department and agency to train their members at least once per calendar year.
- 5. Other
 - i. <u>H.B. 670</u> / <u>S.B. 912</u> Authorizes forfeiture of certain ERS benefits, pursuant to court order, for state or county employees and designated beneficiaries who are convicted of an employment-related felony.
 - ii. <u>S.B. 589</u> Removes the sunset provision in Act 38, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017 (technology transfer).
 - iii. <u>S.B. 873</u> Authorizes contested case hearings to use interactive conference technology.
 - iv. <u>S.B. 1034</u> Authorizes boards, in conjunction with in-person meetings, to use interactive conference technology to remotely conduct public meetings. Authorizes boards to exclude the public from nonpublic locations where board members are physically present when remote board meetings are held by interactive conference technology. Establishes requirements for the conduct of remote meeting. Requires remote meetings held by interactive conference technology to recess for a maximum prescribed period when audiovisual communication cannot be maintained by the board and allows the meeting to be reconvened under certain circumstances. Establishes a new notice requirement to provide the board's contact information for the submission of written testimony by electronic or postal mail, which also applies to remote meeting agendas. Allows for additional courtesy sites open to the public for remote and in-person meetings held by interactive conference technology.
