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Executive Director Gluck stated that Staff Attorney Campbell was working with University of Hawai'i personnel to present a joint training on ethics and technology transfer.

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Regarding the financial report, Executive Director Gluck stated that the office has reduced expenditures to comply with COVID-related budget cuts and that the office was within budget.

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Regarding financial disclosure filings, Executive Director Gluck stated that everyone who had been required to file a financial disclosure statement by May 31, 2021, had now done so. The Commissioners commended the staff for this accomplishment.

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Regarding The High Road, Executive Director Gluck stated that staff had updated the design of the newsletter and that Associate Director Yoza continues to produce most of the high-quality content.

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Executive Director Gluck stated that the COGEL conference would be held virtually, rather than in person, and asked whether any commissioners would like to attend. The Commission discussed the conference with staff; several commissioners stated that they would consider whether to attend, but no decisions were made.

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Sandy Ma of Common Cause asked whether there would be a training for lobbyists. Executive Director Gluck stated that he did not know when the training would be held but that it would likely occur in December or January.

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Ms. Ma then asked whether there are set standards for the waiver of penalties for late filing of financial disclosure filings. Executive Director Gluck stated that the standards are set forth in the administrative rules and that he would follow up with her after the meeting.

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MANDATORY ETHICS TRAINING.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that requiring all state 2 officers and employees to be educated on the state ethics code 3 is in the best interests of the State. Regular training by the 4 state ethics commission will ensure that state employees are 5 aware of current ethics laws, and will increase the public's 6 confidence in state government. 7 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish an 8 online ethics training course to be designed and administered by 9 the state ethics commission and to make ethics training 10 mandatory for all state officers and employees. 11 SECTION 2. Section 84-42, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended to read as follows: 13 "[f]§84-42[f] Mandatory ethics training course.
