33 **CALL TO ORDER**

34  
35 Chair Wood called the meeting to order at 9:06 a.m. and confirmed that in  
36 addition to herself, Commissioners McCarthy and Tobias, and all staff were present.  
37 Chair Wood announced that if the Commission's video conference connection was lost  
38 during the meeting, the meeting would be recessed and reconvened after the  
39 connection was restored; members of the public were asked to check the Commission's  
40 website ([www.ethics.hawaii.gov](http://www.ethics.hawaii.gov)) for information about reconnecting to the meeting.  
41 Chair Wood also announced that if the meeting was continued to a later date or  
42 terminated, information about this would be posted on the Commission's website.  
43

1 **Agenda Item No. I: Consideration and Approval of the Minutes of the February**  
2 **16, 2022 Meeting**

3  
4 Commissioner Tobias made and Commissioner McCarthy seconded a motion to  
5 approve the minutes of the February 16, 2022 meeting. The motion carried  
6 unanimously (Wood, McCarthy, and Tobias voting).  
7

8  
9 **Agenda Item No. II: Consideration and Approval of the Minutes of the February**  
10 **16, 2022 Executive Session Meeting**

11  
12 Commissioner McCarthy made and Commissioner Tobias seconded a motion to  
13 approve the minutes of the February 16, 2022 executive session meeting. The motion  
14 carried unanimously (Wood, McCarthy, and Tobias voting).  
15

16  
17 **Agenda Item No. III: Executive Director's Report**

18  
19 Executive Director Harris asked Computer Specialist Lui to introduce the office's  
20 new intern. Computer Specialist Lui said the office is participating in an internship  
21 program for university IT students. Intern William Aana will be working on IT-related  
22 projects for the office for about three months. During that time, his salary will be paid by  
23 the State Department of Labor's workforce program. Computer Specialist Lui  
24 introduced Intern Aana, who said he was excited and grateful for the opportunity to be  
25 part of the internship program. The Commissioners welcomed Intern Aana.  
26

27 Executive Director Harris reviewed the training, guidance, and assignment  
28 statistics. He said that staff conducted an ethics training session for all members of the  
29 House of Representatives and received very positive feedback from the participants.  
30 He plans to reach out to the Senate to offer a similar training session for its members.  
31

32 Executive Director Harris informed the Commission that staff started returning to  
33 the office to work. He has asked staff to be in the office at least three days each week,  
34 with the understanding that they can work remotely the other two days.  
35

36 Executive Director Harris said there will likely be many Zoom meetings in the  
37 future and he is looking into increasing the office's bandwidth to accommodate more  
38 Zoom users. There will be an additional cost for this, but he believes it is a necessary  
39 expense.  
40

41  
42 **Agenda Item No. IV: 2022 Legislative Session**

43  
44 Executive Director Harris updated the Commission about the status of legislation  
45 that staff have been tracking. He said both the House of Representatives and the  
46 Senate passed the budget bill (HB 2500 HD1) and the bill will now move to the

1 Governor. The bill includes funding for a full-time investigator and for replacement of  
2 the Commission's aging servers.

3  
4 Executive Director Harris said the mandatory ethics training bill (HB 1475 HD1)  
5 was set for hearing and he expected the bill to continue to move forward. He also  
6 updated the Commission on the bills relating to protocol gifts reporting (HB 2069 HB2),  
7 interns as state employees (SB2138 SD1), Workforce Development Boards' conflicts of  
8 interests (HB2159 HD1), and task force exemptions from the ethics code.

9  
10 Executive Director Harris discussed HR 9, Establishing a Commission to Improve  
11 Standards of Conduct. He was named to the commission, and both he and Staff  
12 Attorney Neuffer have been attending the commission's meetings. The commission's  
13 first report is due at the end of the month and will recommend that certain existing bills  
14 move forward this session. One of the bills, SB 555, is a campaign spending bill which  
15 would disallow campaign fundraising during the legislative session. The commission  
16 has discussed prohibiting fundraising in general during the legislative session and not  
17 just publicly noticed campaign fundraisers. The commission's second report is due in  
18 December and will probably include more substantive recommendations.

19  
20 Commissioner Grauly joined the meeting via video conference at approximately  
21 9:27 a.m.

40 evaluation, dismissal or discipline of an officer or employee, and section 92-5(a)(4) to  
41 consult with the Commission's attorneys on questions and issues pertaining to the  
42 Commission's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities. The motion carried  
43 unanimously (Wood, Grauly, McCarthy, and Tobias voting).

44  
45 All members of the public and staff, with the exception of Executive Director  
46 Harris, were excused to the Zoom waiting room. The Commission and Executive  
47 Director Harris met in executive session.
