IV. 2024 Legislative Matters

New bills of interest, introduced in 2024, are described briefly below. The blue house or senate bill number is a clickable hyperlink that goes directly to the bill language online. If the hyperlink does not work, bills can be looked up at "capitol.hawaii.gov" and the bill number can be looked up in a box in the upper right-hand corner.

- Budget
 - <u>HB 2520</u> (Ethics Commission budget). Passed the State House of Representatives. Pending before the Senate Committee on Ways and Means ("WAM").

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> <u>HB 2655</u> (Funds legislative agency Hawai'i employer-union health benefits trust fund costs). Pending before the House Committee on Finance ("FIN"), no other referrals.

• Commission Procedures

- <u>HB 1881</u> (Maximum administrative fine). Passed House Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs ("JHA") pending before FIN.
- <u>SB 2215</u> (Maximum administrative fine). Passed Senate Committee on Judiciary ("JDC"). Pending before WAM.
- <u>HB 1882</u> (Advice & investigation procedures). Pending before JHA, no other referrals.
- <u>SB 2216 SD1</u> (Advice & investigation procedures). Passed the Senate. Pending referral in the House.

• Disclosure Reporting

- <u>HB 1883</u> (Fiscal reporting periods). Pending before JHA.
 Also referred to FIN.
- <u>SB 2217</u> (Fiscal reporting periods). Passed the Senate.
 Pending referral in the House.
- <u>HB 1884</u> (Legislator disclosures). Pending before JHA, no other referrals.
- <u>SB 2218</u> (Legislator disclosures). Pending before JDC, no other referrals.
- <u>SB 3221</u> (Decreases the gift value amount required to be disclosed). Referred to JDC.
- <u>SB 3350</u> (Requires judges, justices, and nominees for judicial vacancies to file financial disclosures with the Commission). Hearing set on February 15, 2024 before JDC. No other referrals.

• Lobbyist Law

- <u>HB 1885</u> (Expanding definition of lobbying and creating new presumptions of lobbying activity). Pending before JHA, no other referrals.
- <u>SB 2219</u> (Expanding definition of lobbying and creating new presumptions of lobbying activity). JDC scheduled a public hearing on February 12, 2024, for a proposed SD1. No other referrals.

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Campaign Finance

 <u>HB 2184</u> (Campaign Spending Commission bill that prohibits campaign contributions from persons convicted of campaign finance, lobbying, or ethical offenses). Pending before JHA, no other referrals.

• University of Hawaii Technology Transfer

- <u>HB 2502</u> (Eliminates sunset provision of the technology transfer exemption). Passed the House Committee on Higher Education & Technology and pending before FIN.
- <u>SB 3191</u> (Eliminates sunset provision of the technology transfer exemption). Hearing scheduled before Senate Committee on Higher Education. Also referred to JDC.

• Fair Treatment

<u>SB 2623</u> (Allows legislators to use state equipment for bona fide community initiatives within their respective districts).
 Referred to Senate Committee on Government Operations, JDC/WAM.

County Ethics Commissions

 <u>SB 2989</u> (Allows Judicial Council to nominate persons for appointment to a county ethics commission, provided that the charter or ordinance allows it). Referred to Senate Committee on Public Safety and Intergovernmental and Military Affairs and JDC.
