New bills of interest, introduced in 2024, are described briefly below. The blue house or senate bill number is a clickable hyperlink that goes directly to the bill language online. Bills that have not yet "crossed over" are generally considered dead for this legislative session.

 - <u>HB 2520</u> (Ethics Commission budget). Act 002 (3/14/2024).

Commission Procedures

- <u>HB 1881</u> (Maximum administrative fine). Transmitted to House (4/9/2024).
- <u>SB 2216 SD1</u> (Advice & investigation procedures). Received notice of disagreement (4/5/2024).

• Disclosure Reporting

- <u>SB 2217</u> (Fiscal reporting periods). Received notice of disagreement (4/5/2024).
- <u>HB 1884</u> (Legislator disclosures). House disagrees with Senate amendments (4/9/2024).

• Campaign Finance

- <u>HB 2184</u> (Prohibits campaign contributions from persons convicted of campaign finance, lobbying, or ethical offenses). House disagrees with Senate Amendments (4/9/2024).
- University of Hawaii Technology Transfer
 - <u>SB 3191</u> (Eliminates sunset provision of the technology transfer exemption). Received notice of disagreement (4/4/2024).
